## Your Excellency,

We are writing concerning the 17<sup>th</sup> Meeting of States parties to the Convention on the Rights of the Child (New York, **29 June 2018**), which will elect nine members of the Committee on the Rights of the Child (Committee).

As a State party to the Convention, you have the opportunity to **ensure the effectiveness of the Committee** by nominating and electing the most qualified and suitable experts from among the candidates. To this end, Child Rights Connect strongly encourages you to take into account the official criteria highlighted in the <u>note verbale</u> that you have received from OHCHR, as well as the following additional ones when nominating and voting for candidates:

- The candidate's **independence** and lack of conflict of interest (as per the Addis Ababa Guidelines);
- The relevance of the candidate's **expertise** and **skills** for the work of the Committee;
- The candidate's experience working with a **broad range of stakeholders** (e.g. UN agencies, NHRIs, NGOs), including children themselves;
- The candidate's **commitment to listen to children** directly and give due consideration to their views;
- The candidate's ability to **devote sufficient time** to the work of the Committee;
- The candidate's ability to communicate fluently in **English**, **French or Spanish**;
- The current composition and under-representation of certain regions (South-east Asia and Latin America) and areas of expertise (child participation/interaction with children, public health, economy, humanitarian law and legal complaints handling). You will find here a table with an overview and detailed analysis of the current composition of the Committee

We would also like to draw your attention to the TB-Net event on <u>Promoting Quality, Independence</u> <u>and Diversity in Treaty Body Membership: the Importance of Transparent and Participatory Nominations and Election Processes</u> during which States exchanged good practices to ensure good Treaty Body members. You can read the event's report <u>here</u>.

## Information on nominated candidates

As in previous years, Child Rights Connect will promote a merit-based and transparent elections process by sending questionnaires to all nominated candidates. Their responses will be made publicly available at <a href="www.untbelections.org">www.untbelections.org</a>. We are also contacting national, regional and international NGOs working in child rights to get their views about the nominees.

We would be grateful if you could share this information widely, with your relevant domestic authorities, elections` officers and other State missions.
